

All thy anxious vigils o'er.


All the nations shall be gathered

They were the parents of four children: Willard, Josephine, John and Charles.

## Portrait of Wells Wintemute Coates (1895 - 1958)

### *Famous Architect and Designer*

**W**ells Wintemute Coates is viewed as one of the pioneers of the modern movement in British architecture. A 3rd great-grandson of Georg Philip Windemoed, he lived his first fifteen years in Japan with his parents who were Canadian Methodist Missionaries.

In 1913, Wells finished an ambitious world tour with his father traveling to China, Java, Burma, India, Egypt, Europe, the USA and ended in Canada where he enrolled at the University of British Columbia to study engineering. His studies were interrupted by WWI, after which he moved to London where he obtained a PhD in Engineering at East London College.

He began practicing as an Architect in London in 1928. His designs included flats, shops, offices, houses, interiors, radio and technical furniture, and a yacht. These projects each illustrated his commitment to a functional aesthetic and of his refusal to compromise his own high standards.

were an attempt to answer the constraints of modern living by providing the simplest accommodation which would give maximum comfort from minimum materials.

Wells married Marion Grove in 1927. His only child Laura, was born in 1930. "So when Marion came," he wrote in 1927, "I found for the first time a personal direction, and this direction led me away from intellectual abstractions." Their passionate marriage became deeply unhappy and ended in separation in 1937.

Lawn Road Flats (also known as Isokon Flats) was Wells first building. Now internationally recognized as a key building of the British modern movement, it began as a design for two houses for the clients Jack and Molly Pritchard. The flats

Coates's innovative designs for radios of E.K. Cole are among the most successful of his industrial designs. His best known radio, the AD 65, is frequently used to symbolize the design of the thirties.


